Well another sale of Mike's material is over.

First of all I want to thank Jim Gruver for storing the material and also for helping me with loading most of the material for the move to Nancy's. I also want to thank Chris and Rich Hunt for helping load and unload the material.

Helping on the day of the sale were Chris and Rich Hunt, Nancy Bankhead, Jim Gruver, Bob Whiteside, Joan Beiriger, Bob Trimmingham, Diane Day. Also to help with support was Jane Crone and Deloris Colonna. A big thank you goes to Nancy for letting us use her ranch for the sale.

The only problem was that we picked Saturday of Mother's Day weekend. We had several people from Castro Valley Club and I think one from another club came for the sale. Ben Knot came from Fremont and helped give us an idea of what some of the material was and what was a fair price for it, Ben also bought a large portion of the rock. We had several members from our club come and buy.

Sand of the Month

Gypsum Sands

This month we look at sands formed by evaporation to form $\text{CaSO}_4 \cdot 2\text{H}_2\text{O}$ which is the mineral Gypsum.

Gypsum is desolved from the playa floors of old lake beds. As the solution of calcium sulfate losses its water by evaporation crystals of gypsum grow in the form of selenite. The freezing and thawing and the wetting and drying cause the selenite crystals to break down into sand size particles. Wind can then carry this sand over a long distance. When the crystals formed they have a pseudocubic shape with sharp edges, as the wind blows them around they begin to get rounded off. The shorelines were these sands form have high salinity and high summer temperatures.

I have samples of gypsum sands from two locations: one near the Great Salt Lake, Utah and the second outside White Sands N. P. in New Mexico. As I said outside White Sands N. P., there is an area where the gypsum sand collects along the highway just west of the park entrance. **DO NOT COLLECT IN THE PARK.**

The New Mexico crystals have a much better shape then the crystals from Utah.
